DAY 1: *TEAMS IN TRAINING!*

PRACTICAL STRATEGIES FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTRUCTION AND BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT FOR ALL STUDENTS WITH AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER (ASD)

This training will provide participants with the necessary foundation or knowledge base for being able to *effectively* program for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder, utilizing "best practices" from structured teaching. Numerous, practical evidence-based techniques and strategies for effectively addressing the challenging behaviors and learning needs of students with autism spectrum disorder will be shared. Innovative ideas will be given on how to create an effective learning environment for students with ASD in many school-based settings. Participants will leave this training with dozens of highly effective innovative strategies that can be used immediately to meet the unique learning and behavioural needs of students with ASD.

LEARNER OUTCOMES:

Participants will:

- Develop an understanding of the unique learning and processing styles of student's with ASD.
- Learn how to use and implement numerous visual support strategies to teach various skills and increase independent functioning for students with ASD.
- Learn how to engineer the physical environment by providing visual structure to increase comprehension and understanding of students with ASD.
- Develop an understanding of why challenging behaviors occur in people with ASD in relation to the features and characteristics of their disability.
- Develop an understanding of the importance of using visual support strategies with people with ASD, particularly to address challenging behaviors.

DAY 2: *THE CHALLENGE OF CHALLENGING BEHAVIOURS*

ASSISTING FAMILIES IN UNDERSTANDING AND EFFECTIVELY ADDRESSING THE SOCIAL AND COMMUNICATIVE CHALLENGES OF CHILDREN WITH ASD

This training will teach participants/family members how to reframe *their* thinking in addressing challenging behaviors exhibited by a child with ASD by understanding the behavior as a feature or characteristic of the child's neurobiological disability of ASD, particularly in relation to receptive communication and social relation differences. Participants will learn how to best communicate to children with ASD, through the use of highly effective, innovative, and practical visual strategies that can be used *immediately* to meet the receptive communication and learning needs of children with ASD. This training will also provide participants with concrete explanations regarding the social relation areas of difficulties experienced by children and adolescents with high functioning autism / Asperger's Syndrome, followed by numerous, practical instructional strategies and resources specific to social relations skill instruction.

LEARNER OUTCOMES:

Participants will:

- Develop an understanding of why challenging behaviours occur in children with ASD in relation to the features and characteristics of their disability.
- Learn how to use various visual support strategies to communicate to children ASD, particularly to reduce the occurrence of challenging behaviours.
- Develop an understanding of the social relation differences experienced by children with high functioning autism / Asperger's Syndrome.
- Identify instructional strategies and resources to teach children with ASD social relation skills.
- Identify positive behavioural interventions and supports to reduce the occurrence of challenging behaviors in children with ASD.
